*Parking is only FREE on Saturday and Sunday*

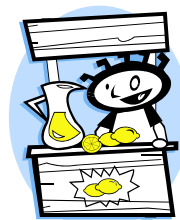

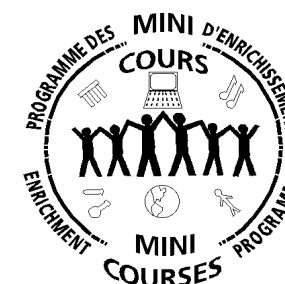

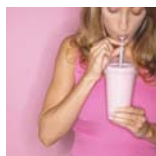

## EMC Scholarship
